



COVID-19 Visitor Safety Message

Covid-19 is not over. In many ways, the general public is much less restricted than in a Nursing Home. Regulatory requirements set in place to keep our resident's safe are slow to be removed, which means we will continue to have more safety measures in place than you may find at your place of work, church, or shopping centers.

- If a family member or friend has tested positive for covid-19, they must refrain from visiting their loved one until 10 days have passed from test date, have improvement in symptoms and no fever for 24 hours without taking fever reducing medications.
- A mask must be worn during times of High Transmission while in the halls/common areas within St. John's. The resident may allow the visitor to remove their mask while in the resident's room. Frequent hand hygiene is encouraged during the visit, especially after touching your mouth or face and after using the restroom.
- When entering St. John's, please look at the sign indication Transmission Level, masking requirement and visitor statement. This sign is updated weekly.
